Training Seminars Tapping Into Potential ICF Markets

Pave been asking ourselves why ICF construction has been exploding in some areas when there has not been a lot of activity in other areas, such as Northern Virginia. We have always believed that the potential exists for great growth in Northern Virginia; we just need to tap in to it.

Several months ago, in search of answers, **Dave Snider** of Virginia Concrete and I took a trip to Richmond to meet with ICF distributor **Dave McIlwain**. We have always known that he is a great promoter, but we wanted to learn some of his ideas. After spending a day with Dave and

analyzing the challenge, we decided that in order to have more success with ICF, we need to first have more ICF distributors and, second, we need to develop more ICF installers.

We are certainly encouraging various ICF manufacturers to start promoting their products in the Northern Virginia area. To increase the number of qualified installers, we have started a series of all-day training seminars for custom homebuilders and framing contractors.

On May 19, 2004, the Northern Virginia Concrete Advisory Council hosted the first of these training seminars. **Rory Ahern** of Tara Contracting Inc.,

diately to work closely with their ready-mixed suppliers. He pointed out that the more advance notice a producer had about a contractor's requirements, the more likely it was that the concrete order would be filled.

Thomas recommended a minimum of three days notice—and more whenever possible. He definitely got the contractor's attention with the statement,

"Don't order 20 yards for a job, and just before the trucks leave the plant change the order to 40 yards, because you won't get it—and you'll have a half-finished job!"

Producers can help themselves by getting this word out to customers. The pre-placement conference is an excellent time to make sure everyone involved understands the situation. Planning and communication can help avoid problems at the job site.
